A focus on Learning

Our core business at Figtree High School is Teaching and Learning. Our teachers work hard to deliver high quality teaching and learning activities to provide all students with opportunities to achieve to the best of their ability. This year has seen the implementation of the new Australian curriculum for students in Years 7 and 9 for English, Mathematics, Science and Australian History. This has seen some changes in the units of work being taught in these courses. If you have any questions regarding what your child is learning in their different subjects, please contact their class teacher in the first instance.

If your child is having difficulty understanding or completing their work, or they need additional assistance with their learning or they are experiencing difficulty with their organisation and management skills, please contact our Learning and Support Teachers, Ms Sue Clifford and Ms Judy Markham. Additional learning support is also provided to students who have English as a second language (ESL). Ms Evia Kyriacou is our ESL teacher who can be contacted at the school if your child requires additional support due to their language background.

Figtree High School RSL Awards

All staff in the school can issue students with our RSL Awards (Respect, Safety and Learning) as part of our PBS initiative. Staff issue these awards when students are demonstrating the school's core PBS value behaviours. While we have a particular focus behaviour each week, students can be recognised at any time for demonstrating the values of Respect, Safety and Learning through their behaviour at school.

Students are asked to put their RSL Merits into the RSL box in the Student Office area in the Administration Building. Each Thursday, just prior to assembly, Mrs Dive randomly draws out 4 RSL merits from the RSL box so that students can be recognised and rewarded for displaying our school's core values. Students who win the RSL awards are given either a \$10 iTunes card or a \$5.00 Canteen Voucher.

We are very fortunate to have a School Counsellor at Figtree High School every day of the week.

Mrs Mary Idziak works with students on Monday, Thursday and Friday, while Mr John Wilson works with students on Tuesday and Wednesday. If your child would like to speak with one of our counsellors, they can make an appointment themselves or see their Year Advisor or Deputy Principal to arrange an appointment. If a parent would like their child to see a counsellor, they can contact the counsellor by phone at the school to discuss this.

Academic Challenge and Excellence

(ACE) Program

In Term 2 Figtree High School will be offering a unique opportunity for academically capable students to join the **Academic Challenge and Excellence (ACE) Program**. This opportunity is available to students in Year 7, 8, 9 and 10. This program allows students to develop and refine their problem solving and research skills.

Students participating in the program will complete a Problem Solving Project (PSP) in which they will be asked to identify a key problem within a topic area and follow a process to create a solution to the problem. Students will be able to choose their own topic, so they will be able to pursue their personal passions and interests while learning valuable research, decision making, literacy, numeracy and communication skills.

Please note, that acceptance into the ACE program is based on student test results in the AGAT (ACER Academic & General Ability Test) which many students in Years 7-10 have completed previously. Students who have not previously sat the test will have the opportunity to complete it in the coming weeks.

Students who would like to register their interest are required to put their names down and see either Mrs Corbett (HSIE Staffroom) or Mr Simmonds (Languages Staffroom) by Thursday 27th February.

Big Science Competition

All students are invited to enter the Australian Science Innovations **Big Science Competition**. This competition involves completing a one hour 30 question multiple choice exam, here at school. Certificates are provided to all participants and hundreds of prizes are up for grabs just for taking part. Just pay your **\$7.50 entry fee at the front office before week 10**, this term, to be entered into the competition.

YEAR 7 - VACCINATION PROGRAM – 2014

This year our school is participating in the NSW Adolescent Vaccination Program.

This program will offer **Varicella** vaccine (chickenpox) to students who have not had chickenpox or previous immunisation with the varicella vaccine. Vaccinations will also be offered against **HPV (Cervical Cancer)** and **Triple antigen booster (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis)** for all Year 7 students.

Eligible students will receive a separate consent form for each vaccine and must return signed consent forms to the school in order to be vaccinated. A team of specially trained registered nurses will be visiting our school to administer the vaccine on –

Monday 17th March - First Dose – HPV (cervical cancer) vaccine -girls and boys.
- **Diphtheria/ Tetanus/ Pertussis (whooping cough) booster.**

Monday 16th June - Second Dose – HPV vaccine – girls and boys.
Catch up for any students who missed first dose of HPV.
Varicella vaccine – (single dose)

Monday 20th October - Third dose - HPV vaccine – girls and boys.
Catch up for HPV, Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis for any students who missed previous vaccination.

After the students have been vaccinated they will be given a record of vaccination to take home so that you can keep their immunisation records up to date.

If you would like your child to be vaccinated, please complete the Consent forms and return them to the school immediately. If you have any questions regarding the vaccination program please contact the Public Health Unit (4221 6700) or Mrs Kirsten Borst at Figtree High School (4271 2787).

YEAR 9 - VACCINATION PROGRAM – 2014

This year our school is participating in the NSW Adolescent Vaccination Program.

Vaccinations will be offered against **HPV (Human Papillomavirus Vaccine)** for **boys in Year 9.**

Students will receive a consent form for the vaccine and must return signed consent forms to the school in order to be vaccinated.

A team of specially trained registered nurses will be visiting our school to administer the vaccine on:

Monday 17th March - First Dose – HPV vaccine

Monday 16th June - Second Dose – HPV vaccine

Monday 20th October - Third dose - HPV vaccine

After the students have been vaccinated they will be given a record of vaccination to take home so that you can keep their immunisation records up to date.

If you would like your child to be vaccinated, please complete the Consent forms and return them to the school immediately.

They both represented the Wollongong in the U15 Girls team and won their games, winning the State championships and qualifying for the Australian Championships to be held in the ACT in May.

Health Information – Head Lice

There have been some recently reported cases of students with head lice. As such, it is important for parents to take the time to check their child's hair carefully for any signs of head lice or eggs (nits) and treat their child if they have the symptoms, to minimise the spread of head lice within the school community. Due to the lifecycle of head lice, re-treating your child after 7 days is necessary.

Head lice infestations are a common occurrence, anyone can catch head lice regardless of their age, sex, or how clean their hair is. Head lice move from one person's head to another via hair. They do not survive long when they are off a human head and head lice do not live on furniture, hats, bedding or carpet. Head lice have built up some resistance to head lice treatments.

The effective treatment of head lice involves daily combing of white hair conditioner using a fine tooth comb. Chemical treatments are available from supermarkets and chemists, but they can be quite costly. Removing lice and eggs from the hair is necessary to break the lifecycle.

Tips for parents in reducing the spread of head lice

It is best to choose a treatment that can be used over time. There is no single solution to eradication, only persistence.

- regularly check your children's hair
- teach older children to check their own hair
- tie back and braid long hair
- keep a fine tooth head lice comb in the bathroom and encourage all family members to use it when they wash their hair.

Library News

It's that time again. Premier's Reading Challenge for 2014 started up on the 3rd March and we would like to encourage as many students as possible from Years 7-9 to participate and complete their PRC this year. Students need to read 20 books, 15 from the list and 5 free choice books to complete the challenge. Students who find reading difficult can choose from a wide range of text formats including picture books for older readers and graphic novels. Books can be read in electronic format. Year 7 classes visit the library once a fortnight where they have the opportunity to read and borrow. Students who complete the challenge can earn merit certificates in the school merit system.

The benefits of reading on student outcomes has been proven time and time again when reading occurs regularly and is sustained over at least 20 minutes or so.

The extract below is an extract from Chapter 1 of [Stephen Krashen's](#) book ***Free Voluntary Reading*** (Libraries Unlimited. 2011) and is an overview of reading research over the past 40 years. So encourage your children to read and get reading yourself (see Additional benefits)!

Those who read more read better (Krashen, 2004).

Those who read more write better (Krashen, 2004; SY Lee, 2004).

Those who read more have better vocabularies (Lee, Krashen, and Tse, 1997; Cho, Park and Krashen, 2008).

Those who read more have more grammatical competence (Lee, YO, Krashen, and Gribbons, 1996).

Those who read more spell better (Polak and Krashen, 1988).

Those who read more read faster (Anderson, Wilson, and Fielding, 1988).

Those who read more know more about literature (Ravitch and Finn, 1987; West, Stanovich, and Mitchell, 1983).

Those who read more know more about science and social studies (Stanovich and Cunningham, 1993).

Those who read more have more "cultural literacy" (West, Stanovich, and Mitchell, 1983).

Those who read more have more "practical knowledge" (Stanovich and Cunningham, 1993).

Those who read more get better grades in writing class (SY Lee and Krashen, 2002).

Those who read more have less writing apprehension (SY Lee, 2001; SY Lee and Krashen, 1996, 1997).

Those who read more suffer less from writer's block (SY Lee 2001, 2004).

Additional benefits

Older people who continue to read show less memory loss (Rice, 1986).

Reading causes relaxation and may help you fall sleep (Nell, 1988).

Nearly all eminent people were voracious readers: "omnivorous reading in childhood and adolescence correlates positively with ultimate adult success" (Simonton, 1988, p. 11)

All students may borrow and return books before school, and at most lunchtimes. The library is usually also open during Homework Centre time on Monday afternoons between 3 and 4pm. Books can be borrowed for 2 weeks and can be renewed at any time. We also have a range of magazines that can be borrowed for 2 nights. Happy Reading!
